Create a buzz by having Flat Annie visit your chapter. Xi chapter in Texas (Williamson County) has a creative project based on a children's book Flat Stanley by Jeff Brown. The book is about a young boy named Stanley who is accidentally squished "flat as a pancake" when a bulletin board falls on him. Stanley is very flat but otherwise fine. The story goes on to tell how Stanley discovers some real advantages to being flat. He was mailed in an envelope to visit a friend in California for an exciting vacation.

Xi chapter in Texas created its variation on this story with the development of the "Flat Annie" project. By sending out envelopes with "Flat Annie" to

many chapters, they envision "Flat Annie" (Dr. Annie Webb Blanton) traveling to Delta Kappa Gamma chapters in the United States as well as to international chapters to learn about the Society's global membership. They ask for a return of a picture of "Flat Annie" at a meeting or project and for news of what "Flat Annie" learned in her visit to the chapter area. The project provides an opportunity to learn more about other chapters and members. This is good chapter communication. It creates awareness of what the Society is doing in other places.
